

Teaching Artist: Creative Writing Track

Full-Time | \$45,000 - \$50,000

As a Teaching Artist reporting to the Program Coordinator, you will use your education and writing experience to support the growth and learning of youth in our *I Am Art. I Am Change*. *Apprenticeship* program through the facilitation of workshops and classes designed to build their knowledge base. This position aims to facilitate a comprehensive artistic, technical and intellectual understanding and use of the mediums of poetry, prose, essay writing and other forms of creative writing. You will foster a climate that inspires creativity, intellectual curiosity, freedom of expression and critical-thinking, and help recruit and support young people in their efforts to understand, process, and advocate for social justice issues in the community.

This is a hybrid position with work regularly scheduled between Monday – Friday 11am – 6pm. Evenings and weekends may be required.

In this role, you will:

- Develop and facilitate curriculum for the apprenticeship program that introduces new media and techniques, highlights BIPOC artists, canonical artists, and social justice issues/themes.
- Engage and support youth's goals while helping to build their professional, artistic and social entrepreneurship skills.
- Introduce and model respectful inquiry and the acceptance of different world views, cultures, traditions, and identities creating an inclusive and healthy learning environment.
- Play an active role in the marketing, promoting, and recruitment of youth by supporting the planning and execution of events, public workshops, and other aspects of programming.
- Document apprentices' work and progress while supporting the creation and preparation of their long-term public art projects.
- Maintain consistent communication with apprentices to keep them engaged

For this role, you will need:

- Minimum associates degree or equivalent work experience.
- Minimum of two years of relevant experience.
- A diverse portfolio.
- Background in youth development and/or social justice work.
- Experience with managing projects.

The ideal candidate:

- Is curious; always learning and seeking ways to make things better.
- Is conscientious; keeps promises, taking commitments to others seriously.

- Is humble; lead with humility and empathy, respecting and learning from the perspectives of others.
- Has strong interpersonal and professional communication skills with the ability to work, advocate, and build relationships in a collaborative style with a diverse range of people.
- Proficient personal organization skills, ability to handle multiple tasks and prioritize and use time effectively.
- Is able to exercise good judgment and discretion.
- Is strategic and possesses creative thinking and problem-solving skills.
- Has good time management and written/verbal communication skills
- Takes initiative
- Is bilingual (English/Spanish)
